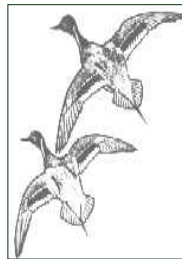

## President's Message

### I'm writing this after just returning from the Shot Show

in Las Vegas, the Mecca if you will of all things shooting in the U.S. This is not the first time that I've made this trip to the show whether it was in Vegas or in Florida; I've never found it to be a waste of time or money. At the State of The Industry Dinner much was made of the evolution of both the NSSF of which we are a part, and the evolution that has occurred in the last 50 years since the NSSF was formed. There were speeches that were very relevant, and inspiring, but for me it was the video that was presented that struck a chord. The video presented not only a narrative history of shooting in America but a visual one as well. I was witness to photos and video from my childhood era showing dads with young kids (boys and girls), out in the forest or on various ranges teaching them the basics of shooting and hunting, there was a bonding going on. I guess it is this bonding that got me to thinking about where we are now as a nation, as a people, as individuals.

We are now in an era where main stream media portrays firearms of almost any type as evil, dangerous, and only having one purpose. We are also in an era when you don't see fathers spending time on the range or

in the field with their children, spending time around the fire at hunting camp. When did this change happen? Where did we lose our way? Most importantly why wasn't I aware it was happening and do something about it? I truly wish I could tell you exactly what happened that wouldn't throw me into exactly the same light as everyone else but I can't. The true is fairly simple but the evolution is a little more complicated and perhaps sinister in nature.

I like so many for so long not only didn't pay attention, I don't think I cared because it didn't at first glance affect me in any way (read this as apathy). Most of us in the very silent majority just sat back all comfortable like many of you still are, and let those who were struggling to protect us continue to do so without any help or even input on our part, many of us too lazy to even pick up the phone and call our representatives to voice out dissatisfaction. Yes, I'm pointing a finger at you but as the old saying goes, "I still have a few pointing back at myself at the same time". We are Americans, when did we allow the Second Amendment to be reduced to magazine capacities, or when it we allow it to be quietly subverted away from what it clearly is, It is the right (not privilege) for every American to own whatever firearm he or she wants, whenever and were ever they want.

I can tell you with some degree of certainty that this started happening sometime after World War II because many if not most of the ranges in this country were built shortly after that great war to end all wars. Our country leading up to this time were known as a country of marksmen, this is why at

least two foreign governments chose to "NOT" invade us conventionally, it would've been much too costly and un-winable. Was this apathy because of the economic boom that occurred after this great war was over, perhaps in part. There was a migration from many of the country areas to the cities where manufacturing jobs were plentiful and wages were often much higher. It stands to reason that with fewer people on the farm there would be fewer people passing on the traditions that they'd learned as children to their own kids. I think that there is more to it than that in reality.

We entered a time where another conflict happened called Korea, then our own Vietnam, both were settled by the politicians and not with the rights of human beings being ultimately considered, this was despite that being a basic principal that this country was founded on. We had politicians running the wars and deciding the outcomes to suit their own agendas whatever they might have been (sound familiar). We evolved to a time where we looked to the government for our answers instead of to ourselves for the solutions as we'd done in the past years.

Social Security was developed "for our own good", and of course it was then changed to help those in power to have access to that money for things that would help them to get re-elected, it at that time also became a tax. We allowed "machine guns" to be heavily regulated because that was something that we didn't either own or perhaps because the perception was pressed upon us that those guns were only used

well we now need to address all guns.

As I've spoken about with many when I returned from England concerning their ludicrous gun restrictions, and how they are an amazing failure at any level. After they completely controlled all firearms in that great country what did they do? ## The Scholastic Clay Target Program

## The Scholastic Clay Target Program (SCTP) is a team-based Program

for students in elementary, middle/junior and senior high school whose goal is to introduce youths to such clay target sports as trap, skeet and sporting clays. These sports can be enjoyed for a lifetime.

With a coach and parent volunteers, it provides a supportive team-based environment using clay target sports as a catalyst. The individual teams can be made up of any number of athletes. Each team has squads based on academic year and experience within their respective

division, Rookie (5<sup>th</sup> grade and under), Intermediate (6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade) and Senior (9<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade).

The minimum size squad for sporting clays and skeet is 3. For American trap, the squad size is 5.

As the Oregon SCTP advisor for sporting clays, I am aware that we have a number of shooting clubs throughout the state that support clay target sports.

What I don't know and have had a difficult time determining, is the status of shotgun youth programs at those clubs. I

would appreciate having youth program directors and coaches contact me so that I can create a list of contacts for these programs. Your shotgun youth program doesn't have to be active in SCTP but I am hoping to create a roster of youth teams that participate in shotgun sports that would be available for future competitive and social gatherings.

Even if you currently do not have a team but are planning on starting one, I would appreciate your contact information. If you don't have a team but are aware of shotgun youth programs that use your club for practice (i.e., 4-H, Boy Scouts),

36111 McGowan Creek Road, Springfield, OR, will be offering a level 1 NRA Shotgun Coach's Training and Certification Course April 9-10, 2011 in the Multipurpose Building, 8 am–5 pm. This two day course certifies you for NRA shooting coach credentials.

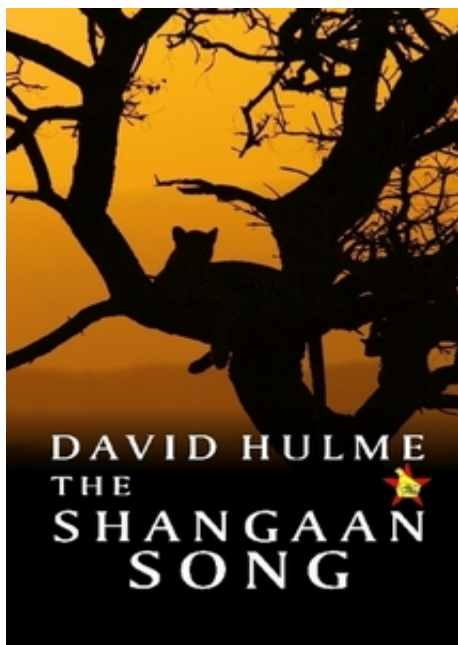
This certification school is two days of sports-specific lessons that teach the coach candidate the basics of coaching. Some of the general subjects that are taught include: safety and risk management, competition events, equipment and facilities, fundamentals of shooting, sports psychology, and training planning. There will be some field time so bring your shotgun, ammunition, eye and ear protection.

The cost per student is \$175, paid in advance, and includes a discipline specific Coach School Student Study Guide. The manual and all other sport-specific references are included in the registration fee. Targets are \$4 extra. Class size limited to 12 to 15 students.

when Rob Dugger resigned as director,

### I have had discussions with the club about restarting the program.

They are agreeable with me doing that, however, there is a catch. I need to bring a proposal to the board, detailing the proposed program, a budget for the year, I have to go through the R.O. certification program and on and on.

This email is the start of the first part of that, in other words the program. Now, right off the bat I will state that I'm looking at scheduling the matches on Saturdays with a couple of two day shoots during the year.

### I need input from EVERY full auto shooter

what do you want in the line of shoots, courses of fire, numbers of runs, costs, scoring, in short, everything you can think of.

What would your ideal day of full auto look like? What would it take to get you out to the range for a full auto shoot every month?

I'm hoping to grow to multiple bays for the monthly shoots. The two day shoots to be on the trap range, multiple lines of fire perhaps combining subgun, assault and machinegun.

For these shoots I would like to use self resetting targets using two spotters to call the hits. I would also like to have these shoots for club members and
